SRDP 2007-2013 EVALUATING SUCCESS

The Rural Development Programme allocates European Union funding for economic, environmental and social projects throughout rural Scotland. It runs in seven-year cycles. In 2015 the Scotlish Government commissioned an independent report into the Scotland Rural Development Programme (SRDP) 2007-2013, shedding light on the achievements, and what needed to be done better.

Strategy

- Stakeholders believed that the SRDP strategy was sound and in line with rural development priorities
- There was an emphasis on environmental projects as a response to a decline in farmland biodiversity
- Sustainability was more important than expansion for non-agricultural businesses

Implementation

- Implementation was a topic of concern and needed to improve
- A complex IT system made the application process difficult
- Regional assessment committees were seen as highly beneficial, sharing approaches and targeting resources

Effectiveness and efficiency

- The SRDP contributed substantially to the rural economy and safeguarding jobs, and stakeholders emphasised these successes
- Stakeholders felt that the SRDP had a positive effect on climate change, renewable energy and water quality
- The LEADER programme funded many effective community-based initiatives
- Bureaucracy was often perceived as an obstacle
- The aims and objectives of the SRDP, particularly in innovation and modernisation, were achieved
- Small rural businesses felt supported
